Live Action News previously covered his battle to survive, and now, in an exciting update, Jemarius has graduated from the NICU and is going home [this summer]. Born on December 20, Jemarius weighed just 13 ounces and measured smaller than a hand. His mother and father, Jessica McPherson and Jemarius Harbor, Sr., told doctors when Jessica went into premature labor to do everything they could to save their son. “We looked at each other in the eye and I told him just give it a try,” McPherson told Fox5. “I just want you to try. As long as you try, that’s all that matters to me. Don’t just up and say that you can’t do it. Just ‘cause you haven’t done it doesn’t mean it can’t be done.” Gina Phillips, Director of Medical Services at Pregnancy Aid Clinics, told Fox5 back in December that Jemarius’s survival “would be [nothing] short of a miracle,” as no other preemie had ever survived after being born so young. McPherson herself had lost two babies previously after going into premature labor at 22 weeks. Lyla Stensrud, who is now a healthy six-year-old, was born at 21 weeks and four days. Jemarius has broken her record by four days, proving that preemies are able to survive at younger and younger ages if given the medical support they need.
