Something New from 40 Days for Life

NEWS FLASH! "Early in the new year, we'll find out about the 18,000th baby saved from abortion as the answer to YOUR prayers! That's because in **January, more than TWO DOZEN cities will launch 40 Days for Life 365 vigils**-praying in front of their local abortion businesses YEAR-ROUND! (I am hoping that this will include cities here in Illinois, although they have not announced which cities are involved.—ed.) That means more lives will be saved at 40 Days for Life locations in 2021 than ever before."

State Essay Contest 2021

The LFL State Federation Essay Contest is for students in Grades 6 through 12. Any Lutheran student in a Lutheran school or church is eligible. Lutheran students may also enter through a home school or congregation (e.g. confirmation class, youth group) when validated by a pastor or teacher.

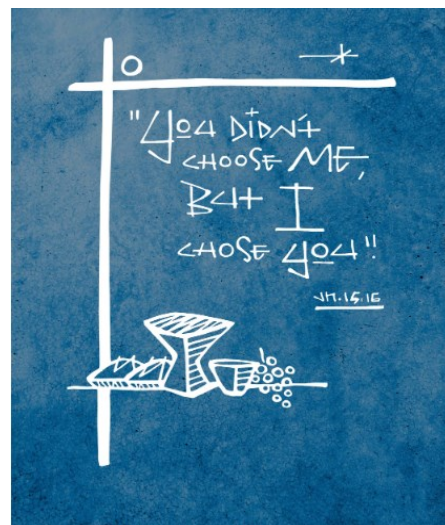
For 2021, students will write a life-affirming essay based on the theme "God Chose You" based on John 15:16: "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit."

Attached to the email that brought you this newsletter is an entry form for the Illinois Lutherans for Life Youth Essay Contest. Your child's English teacher does not need to assign this for them to participate! Any Lutheran student in grades 6-12 may write an essay for the contest. If you have an English teacher who is willing to guide your student in the process, that is great. But if not, they can still take part by following the guidelines attached.

Beyond this help with the mechanics of essay writing, students can talk to parents, Pastor, Youth Group Leader, or their teacher to get guidance with content. Above all, students will want to write about the life issues that they personally find most compelling.

Last year's Junior Winner in Illinois went on to claim the prize at the national level. All of our Illinois entrants had something to say that was well worth thinking about. Until you try, you don't know what you can do!

I checked in with Lynn Cook, a Life Team leader from Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Collinsville to see what was new on the Life front in Collinsville. Lynn gave me example after example of God bringing something beautiful out of all the difficulties of 2020. You may remember from previous issues that her Life Team has traditionally hosted a Christmas get together for seniors at Good Shepherd. That was out this year, but her team chose to canvass

those seniors about their Christmas memories. They gathered the stories into a Christmas memory book. They were able to share it with at least a hundred people who loved the end result. The team at Collinsville has also encouraged other small groups to take up the challenge and send cards to shut-ins. In the end, they are hearing from more people than ever about what a blessing these efforts have been. One team member developed a Life-affirming power point

for youth ministry. It was such a success that they've been invited to provide a panel discussion for their youth. Now the team is looking forward to a special Service in honor of Life on Wednesday, the 19th. They were also able to fill a whole day with prayer during the last 40 Days for Life Campaign. That was, in part, a response to the unfortunate building of Planned Parenthood in Fairview Heights.

Easter: Celebrate the Resurrection with all your heart! He is Risen! Your sins are forgiven. This is the motivation for all we do!

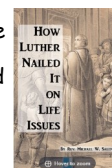

As we contemplate our Triune God and consider growth, it is a good time to mention the growth that occurs unseen before birth... a silent testimony to the infinite wisdom of God. It is also a good time for a Creation event.

Reformation Day: Why not share "How Luther Nailed it on Life Issues"? Perhaps it would be good to observe the day by posting a Life Thought in a public forum...with the advent of the internet, you won't even need nails!

Half A Year of For-Life FUN with unlikely holidays

Jan 23rd "National Measure Your Feet Day" Why not promote with Precious Feet Pins as prizes for the longest feet, widest feet, smallest feet, etc. at your church. Let participants purchase a sheet of paper with blanks for name and contact info, to draw around their feet and then drop into a box located at the church doors, proceeds going to a Life Affirming cause your church supports. Collect baby booties, socks, and shoes for your local Crisis Pregnancy Center. Be the hands and feet of Jesus to help the new maternity home get off the ground.

Feb 1st "National Get Up Day" What a time to celebrate serving the God of second chances! Consider an ice skating event and be sure everyone knows that falling happens to all of us, but getting back up is where we help one another! It is also National Dark Chocolate Day, so chocolate hearts might be a nice reminder that when our hearts are down, Jesus lifts us up. Perhaps proceeds could go to a life affirming agency that helps people needing a second chance, whether post abortion healing, crisis pregnancy, or recovery after human trafficking.

Mar 2nd "Dr. Seuss' Birthday" Celebrate with "Horton Hears a Who" Activities. Theme with "A person's a person, no matter how small" projects...Guess the number of Puff-ball "daisies" in a very large jar and remember God has counted even the hairs of your head...you are never lost to Him no matter how many people you're among... & there are never too many!

Apr 7th "National Walking Day" Walking for Life is nothing new, but maybe this year you want to issue banners hung on pool noodles or 6-ft. PVC pipe to assure social distancing and turn it into the longest train for Life in your community! Walkers can still gather pledges to raise funds for life affirming agencies.

May 24th "National Scavenger Hunt Day" Well, why not? Host a scavenger hunt in a park or forest preserve or your church property if there is room. Admission can go to a Life affirming agency in your community. Be creative. Let folks look for tiny things and remember the least of these among us. Or let them look for objects you have hidden along a trail and snap a picture with their phones to collect. Let the objects have a

symbolic meaning related to Life and add a guessing game element.

Jun 3rd "World bicycling Day" Get involved with Biking for Babies and organize a local biking event. Bikingforbabies.com

Jul 20th "National Lollipop Day" Sell lollipops as a fundraiser. Or Hold a lollipop licking contest: either race to finish one lick at a time or find out how many licks it takes to get to the tootsie center of a Tootsie Pop! Even on a zoom chat that might be fun.

Aug 2nd "National Coloring Book Day" Sponsor a Youth Poster Contest promoting Life. Share the for Life Coloring Book from Lutherans for Life's website with kids at an outdoor "coloring festival". Offer color-themed games and crayon prizes. Have booths for alternative crayon projects like wax paper "stained glass" from crayon shavings or melted crayon art made with a hair dryer.

Even with the Covid rules in place, some outdoor activities can be safely enjoyed together. Many of these are naturally outdoor activities. Others can be facilitated online. The Horton event could involve watching the movie as individual families, but zoom discussion and activities, for example.

Holidays we know and Love, Some Repurposed for Life

January 17, 2021 Sanctity of Human Life Day. This one does not need repurposing. Take time to pray for those facing life and death decisions that they might choose life. Pray for healing and hope for those who have chosen otherwise. Take part in March for Life or other activities that have been planned. Be sure your congregation knows both the value of Life and the certainty of Forgiveness.

February 14, Valentines Day. Celebrate the gift of marriage! Or Use a "Love them Both" theme to support your local CPC. Maybe your church would like to celebrate the day by putting together "Love Boxes". There is a cost. You can see a moving video showing their impact

March 17, 2021, St. Patrick's Day. Patrick, not Irish, was a slave in Ireland. He was told in a dream to go to a certain place and catch a ship, which took him across the channel to Europe at a point in time when Christianity had come there. There he met Jesus and found true freedom, which he took back to Ireland and shared with his captors. This might be a good time to raise awareness of the worldwide problem of human trafficking and remind one another that all people have inestimable value in the eyes of God. Nobody should be considered "disposable" as a modern day slave. Here in Illinois the Salvation Army has programs to deal with this issue.

April 15th, Tax Day. Well, it may not be a holiday we love all that much. But perhaps we could use it to remember our elected officials, pray for them, and write letters encouraging them to honor life in the choices they make...and in how they use our tax dollars.

May 9th, Mother's Day. So many ways to honor the moms who choose life! Ingatherings, Gifts to CPCs in honor of mothers in your congregation, gifts for the mothers in your congregation, change for life bottles. I'm sure you could add to the list!

June 20th, Father's Day. Here's a new idea...why not host a day of disk golf? It's socially distanced, good fun, and lots of dads love it. Let participants collect pledges and give the proceeds to a local agency that helps dads deal with unexpected fatherhood. Or donate to the LFL-IL fund at Lifesong for Orphans so a man who is longing to be a dad can do just that through adoption.



Abigail Women's Center, Mendota

The Abigail Women's Center was begun as a pregnancy resource center in 1997. In 2007, they went medical, allowing them to offer sonograms and other pregnancy related services.

Betty Pappas, the Director of Abigail Women's Center has kindly answered many questions for us.

When asked how she came to be involved with the work at Abigail, Betty explained, "In the early 1980's I was working at St. Francis Hospital in Peoria Illinois as a Nurse in High Risk Labor and Delivery Unit. I would see such young pregnant women 12 years and up who would at 13-15 years, be having their second and third babies. I prayed and asked God what I could do to help these women. God spoke to my heart and told me that some-

day, I would be in charge of a clinic for women. I thought it would happen soon, but our timing is not God's. 30 years later, while being on the Board of Directors for Abigail's, God brought that promise back to my mind and heart as I told the Administrator at the Nursing Home I was working in as the Director of Nursing, that I was giving him 9 months notice to find my replacement. He retorted with, "No, you're giving me 9 months to talk you into staying!" With that, God immediately reminded me of this promise from so long before and I knew that Abigail Women's Center was my destiny from God."

I asked Betty about the blessings of 2020 and she mentioned the addition of a gift of a 4-D ultra sound ma-

chine, the help of a tech company to create a "virtual Gala" in lieu of their annual fundraising banquet, and the special speaker God provided for that event.

Among the things Betty and the staff at Abigail are looking forward to in 2021, are more of Jesus in their lives and ministry, reaching and serving more men and women with the compassion and assistance they need, and working toward the opening of a new center in Princeton.

If you are in the area, you can volunteer to help at Abigail. You can give and pray from anywhere!

We pray for the health and safety of the center staff and clients, for the Holy Spirit to be present there, opening eyes and hearts and making women feel safe there, drawing them to God.

Representation

I don't know about you, but there are times I'm tempted to believe that there isn't really anyone to represent me and my world view out there.

My view is for-life. It is for-life when the life in question is small and hidden within its mother's womb and the adults are considering having it snuffed out. It is for-life when the life in question is an 8 year old lying on her living room floor doing homework, but is shot by random gunfire. It is for-life when insurance companies lobby against providing medical care to those who have lived beyond a

certain age. It is for-life when scientists lobby to gain access to little humans in the embryo stage so they can experiment with them. It is for-life in the presence of violence of all sorts. It is for-life when death is promoted as a solution. Death is obscene! Death is the enemy! How could someone representing me promote death? I am, as I said, for-life.

But then that still small voice calls me back to reality.

"We have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ, the Right-

eous..." (1 John 2:1, ESV)

Where it counts, there is Somebody to represent me!

"God has put all things under subjection under his feet..." Romans 15:27, ESV)

My representative is not powerless, but Lord over all!

"Death is swallowed up in victory!" (Romans 15:55, ESV)

I stand reminded that my help does not come from DC or Springfield and never has. My help is from the Lord, the Lord of Life. —LL

New Maternity Home News

Redeeming Life Ministries, in partnership with the Northern Illinois District of LCMS is working diligently to get the new maternity home off the ground. Redeeming Life Ministries has added a page for the Illinois Expansion to their website. There you read: "In order to redeem the lives of vulnerable pregnant women and their babies, we need local advocates all over Illinois. The local advocates help spread the word about the new maternity home in their churches, organizations and neighborhoods to reach pro-life supporters and ask for support. We have videos and materials to help local advocates build awareness, generate excitement, and share updates about this expansion project."

Advocates let their own congregations know about the new home. They can make members aware of the home's existence and needs, encourage support, organize fundraisers, and be sure that those involved in human care ministry know it is out there, should they find themselves ministering to somebody who needs such a safe haven. An advocate might want to use creative, new ideas and technologies to spark interest and support for the maternity home.

If you choose to take on the role of advocate for the new maternity home, you will also want to be sure the crisis pregnancy centers in your

area have information about the home. Our hard-working pregnancy center workers are often so busy that keeping up with new resources may be difficult to do.

On the same page where you sign up to be an advocate, you can find resources for getting the word out in your area. You can also donate online from that page.

Pray with us that this special safe haven for moms-to-be will soon be up and running! May Father God use each of us to make it happen!
