The COVID-19 pandemic’s effect on US life expectancy has disproportionately hit minorities, according to new studies in BMJ and JAMA Network Open, with the former finding that overall US life expectancy—which dropped almost two years from 2018 to 2020—hasn’t been this low since 1943, during World War II. ... Overall, US life expectancy increased 0.08 years from 2010 to 2018 but then decreased 1.87 years from 2018 to 2020 (78.74 to 76.87 years). ... [T]he researchers note that, at least for the United States, most of the change was likely from the pandemic, as life expectancy increased by only 0.1 year from 2018 to 2019. (CIDRAP, 6/25/21; CLR LifeWire, 7/1/21)

On June 30, Health Canada released the second annual report on (MAiD) euthanasia and assisted suicide. The data was gathered from the reports submitted by the medical or nurse practitioners who caused the death. ... In 2020, there were 7,595 reported assisted deaths up from 5,660 in 2019 and up from 4,478 in 2018. (MAiD) euthanasia deaths represented 2.5% of all deaths in 2020. The number of MAiD deaths in 2020 increased by more than 34% from 2019. The increase in 2019 from 2018 was more than 26% with every province experiencing an increase in the number of MAiD deaths. When all data sources are considered, the total of number of (MAiD) deaths reported in Canada from legalization until December 31, 2020 is 21,589. (Euthanasia Prevention Coalition, 7/1/21; CLR LifeWire, 7/8/21)

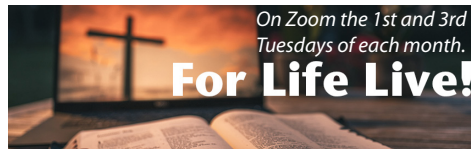
