



## Give Elderly Members a Merry Christmas

## "Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction ..." (James 1:27a)

Christmas is a wonderful and special time of year for many people—especially for all of us in the body of Christ. Christmas is when we celebrate the birth of Jesus in churches filled with singing, poinsettias, Christmas-decorated trees, Advent candles, and programs populated with adorable small children dressed as camels, cows, lambs, and shepherds. Christmas is a time for families—both those related by blood and those related by faith.

But sometimes, Christmas can be a time of loss and sadness for those who are no longer able to take an active part in this holy season's activities. That's where you and I come in.

For many years, women of my church, Trinity Lutheran in Blanco, Texas, have assembled and delivered Christmas "goodie bags" to our members 80 years of age and older. Now the Trinity Life Team is taking over that task. Members bring in calendars for the upcoming year, lotion, warm socks, writing supplies, stamps, home-baked goodies (pre-COVID) or purchased baked goods, and any other thing they think our older members would enjoy. (As an alternative during the pandemic, we asked for cash donations, and the Life Team purchased everything ourselves.) The Life Team then packs these gifts into decorative Christmas bags, adds a label with the recipient's name and address, (you get this information from your church secretary!) and places them in the narthex for congregational members to deliver. Obviously, some members take these gifts to their own parents or neighbors that live near them. For the other bags, volunteers hit the road and make sure all bags are delivered well before Christmas.

### "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 19:19)

Loving our neighbors at any time is great, but a Christmas gift bag is so greatly appreciated by every one of the recipients. The smiles and the warmth that is shared is so very special. (Many of our members look forward to announcing their 80th birthdays, and we look forward to honoring them with a special gift.)

"Show respect for old people and honor them." (Leviticus 19:32a)

May this Christmas be a special time of celebration and unity for all of us—both young and old!

## Moses (The Unqualified)




## "But Moses said to God, 'Who am I, that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" (Exodus 3:11)

"God doesn't call the qualified, He qualifies the called." Saul of Tarsus, the persecutor of Jesus' Church; Simon Peter, the big talker turned coward; Jacob, the liar and deceiver; Elijah, the pessimist and complainer—all were decidedly UNQUALIFIED to serve the God Who lives in unapproachable light.

Then there's Moses. At first glance his resume might look somewhat impressive. After all, he did spend many years in Pharaoh's palace, where he received a first class secular education. He also spent 40 years working as a shepherd in the Midian desert. (Taking care of foolish, stubborn sheep can be useful preparation, I suppose, for watching over God's people.) But let's not forget that Moses was a murderer! Moses, qualified to serve the great I AM? Hardly! Moses had reason to say, "Who am I, that I should go to Pharaoh?"

But God doesn't call the qualified. He calls sinners like Saul and Moses, as well as you and me. It was Saul/Paul who wrote:

"But we have this treasure [the Gospel] in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us." (2 Corinthians 4:7)



In a remarkable way God uses the fact that His servants are unqualified sinners. By using men like Moses, people are attracted to Jesus and not the jars of clay—you and me—who carry the Savior's message. But Paul also wrote:

"For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." (Ephesians 2:10)

God also qualifies the called. Go back to our list of unqualified men from the Bible. Recall how the patient Lord honed, polished, and matured these men of God. Look at the great apostle God crafted out of the proud, Jesus-hating Pharisee. Behold the bold Law and Gospel preacher God fashioned out of a man who at one time wouldn't even defend his faith before a servant girl. See the humble, compassionate, faithful prophet God made out of murderer Moses.

You and I are God's workmanship as well. In and of ourselves we have nothing to offer God. But He gave us His Son, eternal life, forgiveness of sins, as well as the grace to serve Him. By God's tendermercies we are qualified to serve Him now and forevermore!





### Owen's Mission




Horton the elephant was right! The Bible agrees! In fact, the Bible says more: A person's a person created by God (Psalm 139:13-14), a person redeemed by Jesus (Galatians 3:13), and a person the Holy Spirit wants to call to be His child (1 Timothy 2:4), no matter how small!



Owen's Mission is a very special project of Lutherans For Life. The goal of this project is to honor Jesus

by presenting a set of *Touch of Life* fetal models to every Lutheran elementary and high school in the country. We want students to understand the God-given value of each life from the moment of conception. We want students to be motivated by what God has done as our Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier that gives value to life. We want students to value themselves and to value others as persons because of this God-given value.



"I held my little grandson Owen in the palm of my hand. He died at 21 weeks during prenatal surgery to remove a large tumor. The nurse brought him to our son as we waited in the recovery room for Owen's mother. I find it difficult to describe what I felt when I was able to hold him. I had held the 20-week *Touch of Life* fetal model in my hands hundreds of times in front of students from preschoolers to seminarians. Holding Owen revived in me the reality behind those models. I will never hold them in the same way again."





As Owen's grandpa, Dr. Lamb wanted to do something special to remember Owen, honor Jesus, and help others understand the value God gives to even the smallest of lives. With the help of Owen's family, *Owen's Mission* was born. We are training facilitators to present these fetal model sets along with a DVD message from Dr. Lamb.



- Honorarium: Affiliated speakers for Lutherans For Life are not in a paid position. Therefore, we ask that sponsoring groups provide an honorarium for affiliated speakers. The sponsoring group determines the amount of the honorarium. Honorariums depend on number of events. Honorariums begin at \$200.
- Meals: \$25 per day unless other arrangements are made.
- Other: A lectern will be needed. A TV, video projector, DVD player, and screen may be needed.



## The Basics of Lutherans For Life

Our Mission: Equipping Lutherans and their neighbors to be Gospel-motivated voices For Life



**Our Vision:** Every Lutheran congregation upholding the God-given value of human life and influencing society to do the same

#### Structure and Relationships

A local Life Chapter is a local organization that has been chartered by National Lutherans For Life. The Life Chapter is formally associated with and subject to, but not a part of, the corporation known as Lutherans For Life, Inc.

A State Federation is an organization that has been chartered by Lutherans For Life, Inc., in a state where there are at least five chartered Life Chapters. In a state where a State Federation exists, the Life Chapters also become affiliated with the State Federation. This occurs automatically at the same time a Life Chapter becomes chartered by Lutherans For Life, Inc. These relationships are basically the same whether or not the Life Chapter is incorporated. Thus, Lutherans For Life consists of a network of individual entities formally associated with each other.

#### Membership Information

All officers of State Federations and Life Chapters and Life Ministry Coordinators must be members in good standing of Lutheran congregations and members of National Lutherans For Life.

Membership contributions are divided among the national organization, State Federation, and local Life Chapter if it is chartered.

Life Chapters that wish to include a membership form in newsletters or correspondence are asked to maintain the form and information provided by the national office.

The local Life Chapter may not establish its own membership program since LFL has a "unified membership" program. When sending a membership form to the national office, make sure the Life Chapter name and number, if chartered, is written on the form in the space provided. This will ensure that the State Federation and local Life Chapter receive the proper remittance payment.

#### **Membership Classifications**

#### Annual Membership

• Annual members join by making a membership donation accompanied by a completed copy of the membership form (or by joining online).
