Suicidal thoughts & behavior

In 2019, 47,500 people died by suicide.

That was 1 death every 11 minutes.

Overwhelming guilt after abortion

Compared to women, men noted feelings of despair much longer after an abortion decision, and they were at greater risk for chronic grief.

In fact, after participating in an abortion decision, men reported negative reactions including:

- 88% felt grief and sadness,
- 82% expressed guilt, and
- 40% experienced post-abortion syndrome.

Prison

Incarcerated people were infected with coronavirus at a rate five times higher than the general population.

As of April 2021, more than 661,000 inmates and staff were infected, and 2,990 people died from the virus.

The effects of holding a grudge include:

- bitterness and anger brought into new experiences,
- inability to experience joy in the present moment,
- depression or anxiety,
- lack of meaning or purpose,
- conflict with spiritual beliefs, and
- loss of enriching connectedness with others.
