



## A History of Caring for Life

So often, only one side of an argument is entertained. We all understand the maxim, "The squeaky wheel gets the oil!" Saying something more often and more loudly, even when it is untrue, is one way people of the opposing viewpoint make their argument and gain adherents.

Case in point, the "Pro-choice movement" has consistently and loudly championed one argument for abortion as:

"Pro-lifers don't care about women, and they don't care about babies once they are born. They have no right to speak against abortion unless they are willing to care for these children."

This argument is recorded on the website: www.epm.org/resources/2010/Feb/18/39-major-prochoice-arguments-and-their-refutations/

First, anyone who recognizes that abortion takes the life of an innocent child always has the right to speak up for that child and speak out against the act that directly harms that child! Abortion kills human beings who are loved by their Creator. God has chosen them for life in His gracious activity of conceiving them in the womb. What God has created and chosen to love in His Son Jesus Christ for eternity let us never bring to an abrupt end by our own actions, disregarding what God has chosen for Himself.



Second, caring for women is provided through many positive instances of support and concern for those vulnerable to abortion. Ever since Lutherans For Life took to the For Life field, our constituent members have opened hearts and pocketbooks to care for the woman who is pregnant. We have paid for pre-natal care. We have supported pregnancy resource centers that provide parenting classes and maternity care. We have supported and encouraged homes where pregnant women who are kicked out of households or lack support of partners and family could be safe, warm, and loved while delivering their child into this world. Many of these homes also provide a time of transition after birth. They support education, job training, and financial planning to give this woman and her new child a fresh start in moving forward in their lives.

Finally, caring for babies is at the heart of all that Lutherans For Life encourages and accomplishes.

Those same pregnancy resource centers provide diapers, daycare, and support for parents caring for their newborn babies. Additionally, LFL encourages support for adoption agencies and adoptive families. This helps the birth mothers or couples who cannot keep their child while also providing a loving family to that child in need of caring parents.

Let me give a concrete example of why this "Pro-choice" argument holds no water. Here is what one Life Chapter has done specifically.



First, someone interested at the chapter level took classes in sidewalk counseling. Through this they became sensitive and trained to meet the needs of the abortion minded woman (and her partner) as they came to an abortion center. Through a caring conversation and explanation of help that would be provided, a connection was made, and a life was saved. A baby was born and not aborted.



Help didn't stop there. The mother was supported in her education goals. Some of the congregations donated funds to help the mother complete her career training. As she was involved in career training, members of the LFL Chapter and of the constituent congregations opened their homes to provide daycare and support. As the child and their siblings grew older, the whole family was invited to church. Invitations proved fruitful and relationships flourished. Eventually, baptisms happened for the children of the family. This provides not just a "this life" perspective, but an eternal life perspective!

These children are not just cared for now in time, but by God for an eternity! What a wonderful blessing inclusion in the family of God obtains.

But help didn't stop there either. As the children continued to grow, there was opportunity to support Christian school participation. Once again, the Life Chapter and constituent members and congregations could marshal the support and financial encouragement to meet the needs of this family. Through LFL Chapter support, not only was a child saved from an abortion provider's scalpel, but this child was given eternal life in Baptism and funded with growth in wisdom and stature as their educational need was met.

## Does this sound like "Pro-lifers" care nothing for the woman or the child once the baby is born?

Here is where we continue to encourage your support. Here is where you too can join in the work of Gospel-motivated voices for Life! Your Life Team or Life Chapter could duplicate this story over and over. Imagine the hundreds, maybe thousands, of babies across America who could not only see life but thrive in that life because of the support of For Life Lutherans in your congregations and communities.

Isn't that a wonderful picture? Wouldn't that be a worthy goal for your group to commit to in this coming year?

What do you need to see it to fruition? First, find out where the babies are destroyed in your community. Where is the building where babies are torn from wombs, or the abortion pill is distributed to those vulnerable to abortion in our society? Next, find out how you can support those already on the Frontlines in that setting. What groups are meeting the needs of abortion-minded women and couples? What gaps are aching to be filled? Where can your time and talents be best utilized? Then, go and fill those gaps! Get involved in saving lives and supporting those vulnerable to abortion in your community.

Finally, share the work you are doing with your congregation and Life Teams and Life Chapters. Celebrate the Gospel-motivated work for Life you are completing. Encourage the involvement of everyone, whether writing checks, authoring prayer cards, or skillfully navigating the sales of diapers and filling the supply chain abundantly. There is always work to be done, no matter how skillful or aged the hands. Find ways to share the load and give encouragement for others to join in the effort of saving and supporting life.

Prove the argument wrong in your community one life at a time!



## Million Dollar Life Match

Applications are now open for the 1 John 3 Initiative Million Dollar Life Match, a program of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) that seeks to support LCMS congregations involved in providing beginning-of-life care in their local communities. The program allows for up to \$1 million in matching-fund grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$50,000. Any LCMS congregation is eligible to apply.

Some possible uses for the funds are:

- Congregational efforts in pregnancy and infant support (for example, Swaddling Clothes).
- Congregational partnerships with LCMS Recognized Service Organizations in adoption services and maternal and family support (for example, Redeeming Life Outreach Ministries).
- Congregational partnerships with Christian pregnancy resource centers (for example, Care Net).

The above list should not be considered comprehensive or limiting to congregations that wish to apply for a grant. If desired, congregations and circuits may collaborate on a project and application. The congregation completing the application will be the one to receive the grant award.

The Million Dollar Life Match grant process will be conducted in three phases, with the following application deadlines and award dates:

- Phase 1: Applications are due April 8, with awards made in June and reports due November 15.
- Phase 2: Applications are due July 1, with awards made in September and reports due March 1, 2023.
- Phase 3: Applications are due April 1, 2023, with awards made in June 2023 and reports due November 1, 2023.

## Life Means Hope

Give a man a fish, and he'll eat for a day. But teach him to fish, and he'll eat for a lifetime. Address the sanctity of life with laws, and we may change a neighbor's behavior. This one may become an obedient citizen. But envelop the matter in the Gospel, and we will change the neighbor's heart. That one becomes a brother or a sister in Christ. Why fling a few coins or a couple crumpled bills when you can break the bank and empty the treasury?

Lutherans bring a distinctive voice to conversations about life issues. We do not deny the suffering they sometimes involve. Surprise pregnancy or terminal diagnosis can leave people feeling afraid, abandoned, ashamed. Most who support abortion, endorse physician-assisted suicide, or engage in embryocidal biotechnologies do so in anxiety or anger. Legislation and elections apply a necessary triage to the immediate trauma. Protesting and closing clinics treat the symptoms.

But only God's truth and Christ's love cure the root condition of sinful selfishness. We come with a courage, a compassion, and a community that relieves and heals. We have hope and joy to give. No one needs to use death as a solution once they know the Lord creates, redeems, and calls every human life to be His own precious treasure from fertilization to final breath. (And beyond that, forever!) Whatever a person's size or skills or circumstances, we can lead our culture to receive him, to receive her, to rejoice in every member of our race as a gift and a privilege.

Lutherans For Life delights to put this ministry into practice across the country. Our Owen's Mission project leads chapel services and teaches classroom discussions. Our Y4Life initiative engages youth and networks students. Our Word of Hope hotline provides post-abortion and crisis care. Our Life Teams, Life Chapters, and State Federations connect volunteers in taking local action. Our professional staff prepare life-affirming articles and devotions, brochures and booklets, podcasts and social media posts, in-person education and online presentations. And we proudly partner with and represent LWML as recipients of a series of district awards along with a generous 2019-2021 national mission grant!





## Owen's Mission



Owen's Mission is a very special project of Lutherans For Life. The goal of this project is to honor Jesus

by presenting a set of *Touch of Life* fetal models to every Lutheran elementary and high school in the country. We want students to understand the God-given value of each life from the moment of conception. We want students to be motivated by what God has done as our Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier that gives value to life. We want students to value themselves and to value others as persons because of this God-given value.



"I held my little grandson Owen in the palm of my hand. He died at 21 weeks during prenatal surgery to remove a large tumor. The nurse brought him to our son as we waited in the recovery room for Owen's mother. I find it difficult to describe what I felt when I was able to hold him. I had held the 20-week *Touch of Life* fetal model in my hands hundreds of times in front of students from preschoolers to seminarians. Holding Owen revived in me the reality behind those models. I will never hold them in the same way again."





As Owen's grandpa, Dr. Lamb wanted to do something special to remember Owen, honor Jesus, and help others understand the value God gives to even the smallest of lives. With the help of Owen's family, *Owen's Mission* was born. We are training facilitators to present these fetal model sets along with a DVD message from Dr. Lamb.

## Need a Speaker?



Lutherans For Life will work with you to help meet your needs for a speaker at a rally, convention, Bible study, worship service, public or parochial school, college/university, or workshop/seminar. A variety of formats are available.

#### General speaker guidelines (may vary by individual):

- Airfare/Mileage: Actual airfare and/or current standard IRS mileage rate to airport or event.
- Lodging: Quiet, nonsmoking hotel room.
- Honorarium: Affiliated speakers for Lutherans For Life are not in a paid position. Therefore, we ask that sponsoring groups provide an honorarium for affiliated speakers. The sponsoring group determines the amount of the honorarium. Honorariums depend on number of events. Honorariums begin at \$200.
- Meals: \$25 per day unless other arrangements are made.
- Other: A lectern will be needed. A TV, video projector, DVD player, and screen may be needed.



## The Basics of Lutherans For Life

Our Mission: Equipping Lutherans and their neighbors to be Gospel-motivated voices For Life



**Our Vision:** Every Lutheran congregation upholding the God-given value of human life and influencing society to do the same

#### Structure and Relationships

A local Life Chapter is a local organization that has been chartered by National Lutherans For Life. The Life Chapter is formally associated with and subject to, but not a part of, the corporation known as Lutherans For Life, Inc.

A State Federation is an organization that has been chartered by Lutherans For Life, Inc., in a state where there are at least five chartered Life Chapters. In a state where a State Federation exists, the Life Chapters also become affiliated with the State Federation. This occurs automatically at the same time a Life Chapter becomes chartered by Lutherans For Life, Inc. These relationships are basically the same whether or not the Life Chapter is incorporated. Thus, Lutherans For Life consists of a network of individual entities formally associated with each other.

#### Membership Information

All officers of State Federations and Life Chapters and Life Ministry Coordinators must be members in good standing of Lutheran congregations and members of National Lutherans For Life.

Membership contributions are divided among the national organization, State Federation, and local Life Chapter if it is chartered.

Life Chapters that wish to include a membership form in newsletters or correspondence are asked to maintain the form and information provided by the national office.

The local Life Chapter may not establish its own membership program since LFL has a "unified membership" program. When sending a membership form to the national office, make sure the Life Chapter name and number, if chartered, is written on the form in the space provided. This will ensure that the State Federation and local Life Chapter receive the proper remittance payment.

#### Membership Classifications

#### Annual Membership

• Annual members join by making a membership donation accompanied by a completed copy of the membership form (or by joining online).

#### Sponsor Membership

- Sponsor members pledge to contribute a certain amount each month and to pray regularly for Lutherans For Life.
- Sponsor members receive a monthly letter from the executive director.
- Sponsor members are asked to renew their monthly pledge each year as part of the annual membership drive.

#### The Remittance Program of LFL

All MEMBERSHIP donations are shared with the chartered State Federation and/or local Life Chapter to which the particular members may belong. The membership donations are divided as follows:

#### Annual Memberships:

- 20% goes to the local Life Chapter (If there is no local Life Chapter, this 20% goes to the State Federation.)
- 20% goes to the State Federation
- 60% remains at national

#### Sponsor Memberships:

- 1/12 goes to the local Life Chapter (If there is no local Life Chapter, this 1/12 goes to the State Federation.)
- 1/12 goes to the State Federation
- 10/12 remains at national
