

First Steps, Marching into a Post-Roe America

At the National Level, March for Life leaders have announced the theme for 2023: First Steps, Marching into a Post-Roe America. The overturn of Roe vs. Wade gives some new direction to the effort to end abortion. Though there will be a National March, the Supreme Court will no longer be the end-point of the March in Washington. After all, the Court has done it's work and returned the decision to the states. This also redirects the effort to end legalized abortion to the state level. The National organization

would like to see a March for Life in the State Capital of each state. That is an ambitious undertaking! It also makes it likely that there will be a different location for the March for Life in Illinois in 2023... Springfield!

There is no real need to make the March in January, the anniversary of Roe vs. Wade, either. They are looking at dates in Mid-March, which may allow those who cannot safely go out in the frigid weather of an Illinois January to participate. For those of us from the Christian perspective, this falls closer to the Annunciation, which

is a good time to remember that Jesus came into the world just as we all do, as a preborn child! Stay tuned for the specifics as they are made available. When we have dates, times, and locations, we will let you know!

Speakers at the March for Life Rally have always been a blessing, so I hope the change in season and venue will make it possible for more of you to be likewise blessed!



God's Word to Encourage Pro-Life Hearts

"Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path," reads Psalm 119:105. For Christians, there is no doubt that the Bible guides us and illuminates our walk with Jesus. Yet for one who is active on the battlefield for the sanctity of life, God's Word can offer so much more.

"We are all Nehemiah," suggested abortion survivor Melissa Odhen at the 2022 Lutherans for Life National Conference - Blessed for Life. Her story of surviving an abortion intended to kill her is both heart-rending and triumphant (learn more about Melissa at https://melissaohden.com/.)

Nehemiah was a man of prayer who

sought God's will for His people. As a great leader of Israel, he recounts firsthand the powerful story of the rebuilding of ancient Jerusalem's walls after the exile. This rebuilding, in the face of great odds, represented the people's renewal of faith, their overcoming of national shame, and the reforming of their conduct.

Like Nehemiah, we are each called to help lead in a rebuilding, to seek a renewal of faith, a restoration of Godpleasing values, and Lord willing, a repentance across our nation to overcome our national shame for America's culture of death and restore us to the God who created, redeemed, and renews us.

That's a tall task, and a weary one. And it is one that we may not succeed at on this side of heaven. But do not despair, like Nehemiah, we will strive to act as one body of Christ. As Nehemiah, we will confess the sins of the people and beseech God on our knees to forgive and restore all who have forsaken Him.

Even against all odds, in the pattern of Nehemiah, we turn to the Lord Almighty to preserve us and find, like our ancient brother in Christ, that "the Joy of the Lord" is our strength" (Nehemiah 8:10).

An Eye on our Lawmakers and IVF Info

Our Illinois lawmakers are amending again. Now the bill being amended to include a "right" to such things as abortion and IVF is House Bill 5779. You will want to keep an eye on this, contact your state representative, and sign a witness slip when they are open for that. In the event that you are not aware of the Life implications of IVF, I am including the following from a 2017 article by Pastor Salemink of Lutherans for Life:

"The desire for descendants comes from God. He has given within us the holy longing to hold our own offspring. He Himself has bestowed upon us the heavenly blessing of having babies....

Pregnancy comes about only in accordance with His will. "Behold, children are a heritage from the Lord" (Psalm 127:3a). It does not operate as mechanical or automatic "reproduction," as if apart from our Creator. Whatever the circumstances or mechanisms of conception, it constitutes a gift of God. Zygotes, embryos, and fetuses always amount to full-fledged human beings, however they originated. "Let the children come to me; do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God" (Mark 10:14b). Even out of sexual assault, infidelity, or other awfulness, children bear no blame for their parents' mistakes. God's grace gets credit for every conception. Indeed, Lord God retains all responsibility for every opened womb (Genesis 20:17, 29:31, 30:22)—and reserves every right to close wombs (Genesis 20:18, 30:2; 1 Samuel 1:5-6). So, unsurprisingly, the devil directly

assaults procreation. Sin's intrusion

into human nature significantly impacted the privilege of producing children, making it more difficult and at times impossible. "I will surely multiply your pain in childbearing; in pain you shall bring forth children" (Genesis 3:16a). Yet Almighty Maker claims even this predicament as occasion to extend His great love. Scripture and its Savior prove sensitive to the sorrows of those struggling with infertility. . .

Still Satan meddles, despite divine compassion, or perhaps precisely because of it. The Ancient Serpent can use infertility as opportune time for transforming desires to idols and twist sinfulness from gifts. Not every strategy or solution for childlessness channels the good and gracious will of God. What about in vitro fertilization? Certainly, many Christian couples have succeeded in childbearing utilizing this technique. The process of IVF, however, presents several ethical questions and problems.

... Typically, physicians transfer a few or even several embryos at a time to increase the odds that at least one makes it....

Sometimes more than one embryo does implant. Many practitioners then recommend "selective reduction" (aborting the additional babies) to improve the resources and chances available to the desired child. In addition, they either discard the "left over" embryos (as "medical waste"), donate them for experiments that destroy them, or hold them in frozen storage to

preserve them for future transfers....

All along the way, IVF risks laying greater weight upon adult desires (and economic concerns?) than the best interests of the child. For these reasons, Lutherans For Life objects to and opposes the use of in vitro fertilization.

We also rejoice that God forgives even sins against life. None of our sins (and we all have sinned and are sinful) can lessen His love or undo His grace. ... We encourage compassionate ministry to them, not condemnation, that they may receive the comfort of Christ. Despite discomfort with IVF, Christians ought not to abandon our brothers and sisters who struggle with infertility. Along with the promises of the Gospel and the body of Christ accompanying one another under crosses, we advocate God-given medical treatment options that mediate the healing power of Jesus. Chief among these is NaProTechnology

(www.naprotechnology.com). This natural procreative approach seeks to investigate, diagnose, and remedy men's and women's reproductive abnormalities rather than circumventing them.

... "the One who has begun the good work in us will carry it on to completion at the day of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6)!"

We invited 10 churches to join us in collecting 10,000.00 for an ultra sound machine in the mobile unit for Mosaic Health. The response was amazing, to God be the Glory! When we receive the match of 5,000. from synod we will be able to pay for the ultra sound machine.

We participated in the Life Chain and the 40 Days for Life prayer vigil at both Planned parenthood in Fairview Heights and Hope Clinic in Granite City.

We made 100 blessing bags to be given to each mom that has an ultra sound at Mosaic Health. We entered essays from our grade school in the LFL essay contest and 2 of them won. We attended a planning meeting in Carbondale and talked about having a Life Team, with a group that is organizing churches to stand for life as 3 abortion clinics are moving into their town.

Now we are planning our Older Adult health care and it is Christmas Dinner and making gift bags for abortion clinics.

for our shut-ins. (this was from an idea in a LFL Directions last year.) We make the bags and put each shut-in's name on the bag and place them in the church for members to pick up and deliver. We made 5 extra that members could take to someone of their choice. It was very successful. We submit life affirming blurbs in the bulletin. Our group is not large (about 15 members of which 5 are from near by churches but we are mighty. Psalm 139

Beloved of For-Life people everywhere, Psalm 139 speaks to our hearts of the everlasting love of God for us from before our first breath. I had hoped to share it with you from the Living Waters Project, a new project of Lutheran Bible Translators for those of us who speak English. It involves the singing of Scripture from the

ESV translation. Since I personally find this a blessing, I started searching for Psalm 139, thinking it might be a blessing to all of us who love Life. As it turns out, Psalms have not yet been covered in the Living Waters Project. When I was not able to find it, my first thought was that I just wasn't techno-savvy enough to negotiate the LBT website, so I turned to my favorite Lu-

theran Bible Translator, my husband Jim., for help.

Jim was reminded that on a recent trip to Scotland a friend there took him to his church. There they have all of the Psalms set to music and that is what they sing on a Sunday morning. He said that it was very moving. But in Europe, the music sung in church typically isn't written, only the words. Jim wasn't sure he would remember the tune, so he began searching for a You Tube of this so he could share it with us at home. In the process, he ran across this one, "Too Wonderful for Words.". It does not claim to be a "translation" of Scripture, but does follow the Psalm fairly closely. It is sung by Shane and Shane. Here is the link so you too, can enjoy it.

God's Word for Life

God's Word for Life is a New International Version translation of the Bible that includes "For Life" commentary on pages with a blue background at various points where Life Issues are addressed in Scripture.. Other of its features are Dates from January 1 through December 31 throughout the Bible to help those who want to read through the Bible in a year. There are also brief summaries and occasional challenges in the margins throughout.

For example the reading for October 31 includes Romans 12—16. This passage includes the following words: "I alone have the right to take revenge. I will pay back, says the Lord." But, "If your enemy is hungry feed him, if he is thirsty, give him a drink. If you do this, you will make him feel guilty and ashamed." Don't let evil conquer you, but conquer evil with good."

The summary of the 4 chapters reads "Paul reminded Christians that God has blessed us. Because of this, we should please him by trying to keep his commands, to pursue unity in the church, to love one another, to pray for enemies, to submit to authority and to watch out for the interests of others."

The challenge for the day reads as fol-

lows: Today: Ask God to help you accept a fellow Christian who is difficult for you to love. Pray for that person, and pray about your relationship with him or her."

I wonder what a difference it would make for Life, if we all took up that challenge? Is it not the essence of "a Gospel Motivated voice for Life" to

remember that God has blessed us and to let that fact motivate our prayers and actions with regard to others? This is a read you might enjoy!

One of Martin Luther's greatest achievements was the translation of

Scripture into the language of the common man. 2022 is the 500th anniversary of that event. As I have pondered the gift of Scripture in a language I can understand, I am intensely grateful.

How would we know that God loves life, if we could not read things like, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly..." (John 10:10, ESV)?

Or how would we know that he loves each of us wayward humans, if we could not read Romans 5:8 "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us..."

I find great comfort in God's Word. We live in troubling times and face daily challenges to our faith, but He knew all about it before time began and assures us: "I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." (John 16:33, ESV)

The Word of God Has many metaphorical descriptions for itself. In one, it is described as the "sword of the Spirit" (Eph. 6:17). I pray that each of us will enjoy daily practice with the "sword", daily feeding from the "bread of Life" (Matt. 4:4), daily cleansing in the word of Truth (John 17:17) and daily find our way by the light of Scripture. (Ps. 119:105)

He has a plan laid out showing us how we are to operate as we carry out Life ministry, how we serve as Gospel-motivated voices for Life. We find our guidance in this and many other Scriptures: "Do all things without grumbling or disputing, that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, ¹⁶ holding fast to the word of life, Phil. 2:14-16.ESV

God's word continues the reformation, reforming our hearts and minds by the power of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It is our privilege to translate it into daily living, shine as a light, and thank God for the gift!



If I had to sum up quickly what does Reformation have to do with the sanctity of human life and the maternity home? I'd go back to Martin Luther and sola Scriptura by scripture alone... and the truth is that the Bible is the very Word of God - authoritative, sufficient and very clear; foundational to our faith and living out our faith as Christians. What does God say about human life? In Genesis 1:27. we hear "so God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them." That means that every mom and unborn baby that comes to the maternity home has intrinsic value as God's creation made in the image of God, and as such is worthy because Jesus loves them and died for them, just as he does us! She may not feel worthy or loved. We have the opportunity as a reflection of the love and forgiveness we've received to introduce her to Jesus though a direct connection to Word and sacrament ministry at Immanuel Lutheran church in East Dundee and to the love and care she'll receive in a Christ-centered home through our prayers, gifts, and acts of service as she works towards completing her education and life skills training to provide better opportunities for them for a brighter future.

Spoon River Pregnancy Center, Canton

You will know when you have found the Spoon River Pregnancy Center by the display in their front window: I Corinthians 13! Brenda Potts, Client Services Coordinator for the Center tells me "It is always to keep in mind how love in action should look"

At Spoon River Pregnancy Center, love in action looks like: pregnancy tests and sonograms up to about 20 weeks; educational classes on pregnancy, childbirth, infant care, toddler parenting, general parenting, court-ordered parenting, fatherhood, life skills, co-parenting, and Bible studies. They also provide material help with the Earn While You Learn program. The clients come in for educational classes. Each class taken gives the client points to use to shop in their baby store (clothing, sizes Newborn - 4T, bottles, breast pumps, wipes, blankets, bibs, baby wash, diaper rash cream, baby lotion, pacifiers, etc.,). After finishing a 12 course curriculum an expecting client can earn a new crib or a new car seat.

Their staff of four carry out that love in action free of charge to their clients, depending on donors who support the work. I know it is short notice, but if you are there in the Canton area, they do have a fundraising event scheduled for November 3rd, so you could still be involved that way, although monthly donations are also welcome.

Brenda tells me that they also receive donations of personal care items that are shared at every visit apart from the earn while you learn program.

The Spoon River Pregnancy Center has partnered with Loving Bottoms Diaper Bank in Galesburg, for about 5 years.. They provide diapers on a

monthly basis for their clients. It doesn't supply all the diapers they need, but it helps a lot! Brenda speaks very highly of the diaper bank.

A big need is for Advocates to work with clients. Training is provided for that. The primary qualifications would include being pro-life, Christian, and with a passion to help others. They see all kinds of situations, so compassion and confidentiality are vitally important. Anyone interested could contact them for more specifics about working as an Advocate volunteer. Brenda says, "If we can help our client know that they are not alone, that they can choose life because they have someone who cares and who helps, then that is why we are here!"

opened to understand they are loved by the Lord of Life! Pray we'll be the friends who invite, no matter what a person's stand may be on Life...God can use even such a small gesture!

40 Days for Life

The Daily Scripture reading and prayer thought from 40 Days for Life on Day 19 (October 16, 2022) read as follows:

"The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. Day to day pours out speech, and night to night reveals knowledge.

--Psalm 19:1-2

Heavenly Father, thank You that creation itself proclaims Your existence and points to Your truth. With the explicit testimony of Your Word as our foundation, may we also help those around us understand that the sciences of conception and gestation reveal profound and immutable truths about You and about what it means to be created in Your image. "

I've never made the connection between the verses from Psalm 19: 1-2 and that fearfully and wonderfully made part of creation known as the human body before! Often we think of nature revealing the Creator in the mighty power of the crashing waves of the sea, the lofty grandeur of mountains, or the beauty of a towering forest. But when you stop to consider the "crown of creation" (Hebrews 2:6-7), awe of the Creator is the only response to: an immune system that works, the nervous system with its lightning-quick responses to stimuli, the system that allows us to get all the nutrients we need and transforms them into a usable form to fuel the functioning of the whole body, or the intricacies of the inner workings of even a single cell! Life is not just a gift, it is an awe-inspiring gift!

When you officially sign up to take part in 40 Days for Life, you will be asked to sign off on a promise to be a peaceful prayerful presence. You can also sign up for the daily prayer/ meditations that they send out during the prayer campaigns. These come from a variety of perspectives, but all include a Scripture passage and a brief "prayer thought" to guide our prayers for Life that day.

Many of the local campaign leaders also put out updates to keep you in the loop on your local 40 Days for Life events. This comes from such an update written by Phil Price, leader for the 40 i Days for Life Campaign in Aurora, IL:

'A passerby coming from Mariano's stopped, rolled down the window and asked the Sidewalk Counselors if they were protesting for or against abortion. The sidewalk counselors said they were Pro Life reaching out to offer Hope and Help to those that are waiting to go into Planned Parenthood. She responded, "I wish you were here when I was in that parking lot years ago waiting to go in for an Abortion"." I feel your presence would have made a difference and I would have chosen life for my baby rather than having the abortion. " She went on to say that she would like to join us and offer that hope and help through peaceful prayer. She plans to take part in the vigil this Saturday!!"

And this comes to us from the Down-

ers Grove 40 Days for Life Campaign, from Sharon, one of the coleaders:

"We saw evidence of that effective power [of prayer] last week at Access when a young woman and her friend tried to enter Access, but found the doors locked. This was quite unusual, because it was well into the facility's operating

hours, and right after they walked away to speak to a counselor, another woman walked right in those same doors unimpeded.

The young woman and her friend took literature from the counselor and left Access without entering as they headed for a nearby pregnancy resource center!

A few 40 Day's praying volunteers watching the activity called it a miracle. We agree."

There are life affirming stories coming out of your local 40 Days for Life Prayer Vigil, too. Why not pray with them and for them? The fall campaign runs through November 6th, so there is still time!

Let's pray the gift of Human Life might "declare the glory of God to many today! May many little ones be allowed to live and fulfill the purposes of their Creator! May God bring healing and forgiveness to those who have been hurt by an abortion choice. And may God bless the witness for Life of 40 Days for Life!
