Blessed with Healing – We live in a world where people are victims of terrible things that happen. We are victims to others (abuse), victims to circumstances (loss), and victims to our own thoughts (powerlessness). The world and Satan tempt us to stay trapped as victims by developing a victim mindset, which separates us from God and all His gifts. A victim mindset enslaves us to constantly fear that we cannot stop more terrible things from happening to us, believe we are powerless to have a better life, mistrust everyone as a potential enemy, and doubt God's presence, goodness, and love. This mindset affects our relationships such that we become self-focused, selfserving, and isolated from others. As a result of this division, conflict, and chaos, we come to believe God has abandoned us as unlovable and unforgivable. Nothing could be further from the truth. God sent His Son Jesus, not only to walk among us in this fallen world, but also to become the Victim for victory over sin, death, and the devil. For all who believe in Him, He shares this victory that brings forgiveness, restoration, renewal, healing, and hope.
