The first speaker I heard in the workshops at the National LFL Conference in Rock Island, IL on October 21st was Father Frank Pavone. The topic he covered was "Braving Persecution in the Fight for Life." Father Frank Pavone is one of the most prominent pro-life speakers in the world. He was ordained in 1988 by Cardinal John O'Connor and has dedicated his life and ministry to ending abortion. In 1993 he requested and received permission to serve as the National Director of Priests for Life, the largest pro-life ministry in the Roman

Catholic Church. Unfortunately, he was recently removed as a priest by the Roman Catholic Church. He has experienced persecution firsthand.

I'd like to share a few of Father Frank's quotes from his National LFL workshop:

"We think and try to live according to the Beatitudes." "Blessed are those who are persecuted..." (Matthew 5:10).

"We're not just working for victory but from victory-a victory already won in Christ's resurrection."

"We brave persecution by pointing out what's going wrong on the other side but never abandoning the truth-God's truth."

"Let persecution be an examination of our conscience. Is there anything I did wrong or can learn from this?"

Let us PRAY for Father Frank Pavone to still be able to joyfully "serve the Lord with gladness" (Psalm 100:2) as a FOR LIFE leader.

Life Comes in Chapters

Our Chapter worked with about 12 local LCMS congregations to request donations to the LCMS Million Dollar Life Matching Grant program. Approximately 25 individuals contributed along with Chapter #268 members to raise a total of \$7144. We were awarded a \$3500 match from LCMS, and a total of \$10,644 was presented to Living Alternatives of Tazewell County for use in equipping their new satellite PRC in Peoria, Illinois. Plans on how the funds will be used are still being considered, but will likely be used to purchase a new ultrasound machine for the satellite

center.

Our Chapter's annual life essay contest is underway, the essays have been written by the students at three local Lutheran grade schools, and Chapter members will be judging the essays and making awards during the early months of 2023.

About a dozen of our Chapter members sang Christmas carols outside the Peoria Planned Parenthood facility on Thursday evening, December 1st. Our annual Pennies for Life collection will be held in about twelve local LCMS congregations on January 22, 2023. This is our Chapter's only fundraising effort of the year, and precious feet pins will be offered to interested donors and church members as a "thank you" gift.

LFL Youth Essay Contest—an often missed opportunity

The theme for the essay contest for 2023 is "Just As...I Am", with thoughts centered around Ephesians 2:10.

We want to encourage Pastors and Teachers to use this tool to help students think through the commandments, starting with the First and not just the Fifth. This will also give pastors and teachers insight into their students. Encouraging students to choose a life topic with a personal connection will increase their learning and the pastor will gain more insight.

This resource is valuable to them for all life topics whether they submit entries or not. Though of course we hope entries will be submitted!

Here are the rules and deadlines...

Any student in a Lutheran school or Lutheran congregation, e.g., confirmation class or youth group, when validated by the pastor or teacher, is eligible. Students may also enter through a Lutheran home school, when validated by their Lutheran pastor.

Include the theme verse in your essay! Examples of topics the essay could deal with are, but are not limited to abortion, the handicapped, adoption or foster care, infanticide, cloning, stem cell research, physician assisted suicide or euthanasia etc.

Essays should include student's name, grade (school or church), and email address. All entries submitted by the teacher or pastor, should include their name and email address. This information should be submitted on the rubric page used in grading the essay. Pastors and Teachers, Please consult the rubric to submit qualified entries.

All sources for references, statistics and quotes should be incorporated within the essay and then included in a bibliography at the end.

Grades 6 - 8 should submit essays up to 400 words. Grades 9 - 12 should submit essays up to 750 words.



What to Say When, a Book Review



"What to Say When" seemed like a good book to read or re-read, in view of the questions we might face in a post Dobbs world. People are beginning to ask questions about abortion itself, rather than Roe vs. Wade, and that is not a bad thing...as long as we have thought through why we believe what we believe. Of course when dealing with believers, Scripture is the basis for our stand and they will "get" that. When dealing with those who are simply parroting pro-choice sound bites, however, this book provides the logic to get them asking real questions, whether they understand the place of God's Word in the life of a believer or not.

It was written while Roe vs. Wade was still the law of the land, so there are a few things that are outdated.

One of my Life Team members who is a retired OB nurse, also has pointed out that some of the situations described as "outlandish hypothetical cases" actually can and do happen, so we need to be sensitive to those who may be hurting because of them. However, on the positive side, it is good to be reminded that we should not be on the defensive, when defense of the lives of innocent children is presumed to be a good thing in any situation except abortion. The book also has some very good reminders concerning the "hard cases". Reminders like the hurt and trauma of rape are not taken away by inflicting a second trauma in the form of abortion! Reminders like there are three people involved in rape cases; one of them is a criminal and should be in jail, one is a victim and deserves our compassion and care, and one an innocent "bystander", who should be protected. Overall, a helpful book. It is good to remember the context. From 40 Days for Life, for those who pray outside abortion facilities and may be challenged or asked questions by total strangers. It provides the means to

answer confidently.

Go Team!

At my home church, we call them "God Moments"; those instances where you suddenly realize that God is doing something and He has graciously allowed you to be a part of it. These moments can sneak up on you when you least expect it. Like when our Life Team at Cross Lutheran, Yorkville, spent one meeting reviewing a little pro-life pamphlet called, "First Words" put out by the American Life League years ago. This pamphlet explored the effects of peo-

ple's reactions to an unplanned pregnancy. Although we chose not to use this particular piece of literature in the tract rack in the Cross Fellowship Hall, good points made were:

- "Pregnancy is a gift from God. No matter how a child is conceived, we should welcome that child with open arms and open hearts."
- Labels such as "illegitimate baby, crack baby, test tube baby" are dehumanizing. The only appropriate label is "baby".

And then came that God moment when a week later, a friend informed me her teenager was about to become a parent. And I had the privilege of reassuring her that babies are always a gift from God, even though this wasn't what she had hoped for her child. We could hug and celebrate the new life because just before I needed the right words, He gave them! Yes, Life teams are to equip...even our own team members! God grant each of you the right words just when you need them!

40 Days for Life -365

This is unabashedly a call to Prayer! I spoke with Phil Price, the leader of the Aurora, Illinois 40 Days for Life Prayer Campaign. According to Phil, prayer support makes a huge difference for those doing sidewalk counseling. With prayer support, more hearts are receptive to the message of Life and thus babies are more likely to be delivered than aborted. Without prayer support, the number of babies saved goes down dramatically.

Last year during the 40 Days for Life campaigns, 2,185 babies were spared from abortion globally. During the past year, 17 abortion workers responded to 40 Days for Life by changing their minds about Life issues and left their jobs! During 2022, 18 abortion facilities where there were 40 Days for Life campaigns closed their doors forever.

Since 2021, 40 Days for Life has begun sponsoring 365 days per

year prayer vigils. You no longer need to wait for just spring and fall. Now you can provide that prayer back up for a sidewalk counselor year round. Not all vigil sites do the year long prayer vigils. Even the 40 Day vigils are a major commitment on the part of the local leadership; this is an even greater undertaking. But it is an undertaking made easier when churches and individuals commit to being that Peaceful. Prayerful, Presence that makes such a difference.

If you or your congregation want to be involved with the prayer vigil at any time during the year, you can take part in the 365 Day program hosted by 40 Days for Life at either the Aurora, Illinois site, or the Springfield, Illinois site. Phil Price, leader of the Aurora Prayer vigil reports that local 40 Days leader-

ship cooperatively with Illinois Family Institute promoted showings of the documentary, "A Matter of Life" during the fall prayer campaign. Evaluation following those showings have led them to attempt once again showing the documentary during the spring campaign. This film is for those who just aren't sure where they stand on the issue of Life. Currently they are looking for congregations willing to host showings of the film at that time. Speak Words of Healing


Even when a surgery is successful, the patient can carry within them scar tissue that causes lingering pain and discomfort. And it's the same in life. Some people around you wear a mask of success, but within, they carry wounds they're unable to talk about. Comedian Jonathan Winters said in an interview that his life was scarred by cruel things his parents said to him as a child. 'I'm no crybaby, but I remember things with almost total recall - there's a lot of pain there.' His father said to him, You're the dumbest kid I know.' And when he joined the Marines and travelled to the South Pacific during World War II, he received no support from his mother. When he returned home, he discovered she had given away his special, personal things he had stored in the attic. He was distressed, but her reaction was, 'How did we know you were going to live?' Winters went on to become one of the world's most popular entertainers and comedians, but the emotional scar tissue remained. Understand this - your words can wound or heal. They can inspire someone or reinforce their sense of failure and worthlessness. Job, who suffered greater loss than most of us will ever know, said, 'But I would strengthen you with my mouth, and the comfort of my lips would relieve your grief' (v. 5). How can you help someone who is hurting? By giving them your opinion? No, by giving them the only opinion that matters - God's! And here is what God says, 'I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore with lovingkindness I have drawn you' (Jeremiah 31:3).

One Love Language: Words of Affirmation...

Dr. Gary Chapman has helped many married couples remember the love that brought them together in the first place and learn how to express it to one another in meaningful ways. His books and conferences use the concept of speaking a foreign language to help people understand why it sometimes happens that two people can try so hard to express their love for one another and fail so miserably! One of the "languages" we might use to express our love is "words of Affirmation". In his resource, "Gateway to the 5 Love Languages", Dr. Chapman describes it like this: "Words of Affirmation—Actions don't always speak louder than words. If this is

your love language, unsolicited compliments mean the world to you. Hearing the words, "I love you," are important, hearing the reasons behind that love sends your spirits skyward. Insults can leave you shattered and are not easily forgotten. "

This is a good reminder that we begin our ministry closest to where we are! May our homes be places where we speak lovingly to one another! And like the pebble dropped in water, may the wavelets of love flow out from there!

The other languages for expressing love? Quality Time, Acts of Service, Receiving Gifts, and Physical Touch. You can get more information at

I spoke with Deaconess Lori Trinche about that. She was quick to tell me that Lutherans in Illinois have been phenomenal in their support of the home. The outpouring of financial gifts, prayer support, volunteer support and expressions of encouragement has been such a blessing to everyone involved in getting the home up and running.

Among those expressions of encouragement was one that stood out in Lori's mind. It came during the season of Advent, when she was visiting

Immanuel, Batavia on behalf of the home. One of the very committed supporters she spoke with shared from an Advent devotional that had been meaningful to her. That thought was that Jesus had come "in the fullness of time", but that it was God's fullness of time, not necessarily ours. Lori was encouraged that the home would be open in God's fullness of time.

In the meantime, work continues on the permitting process in order for the home to be properly licensed to care for moms and their babies.

Her PLAN (Pregnancy & Life Assistance Network)

Seven days in a week...seven dog years to one people year... and did you know another big "Seven" is that there are seven reasons most often leading a woman to consider abortion? I learned this from Anna Stephens of Her PLAN. The mission of Her PLAN is to connect service providers to give care for women based around those 7 reasons. Her Plan provides 3 main tools that Anna wanted our readers to know about:

- a directory of service providers that is available on their website.
- 2. The Pathways to Life Guide, also available on their website. It in-

cludes over 100 models for ways churches can help meet needs for moms and babies. I found this almost overwhelming in the abundance of resources that are provided. One of the most profound is the 7 testimonies of women who went for abortions and what led them to that drastic decision. Understanding this seems crucial to speaking words that resonate and help in a time of personal crisis.

Church questionnaires, also available on their website. These were developed to help church

leadership assess their own congregation's degree of loving service for life and to arrive at possible enhancements to life ministry.

Anna has always been passionate for helping moms and their babies. She says she has been blessed to be a part of Her PLAN, and able to help them every day

help them every day.

Anna also noted, "Post Dobbs we have a beautiful & exciting opportunity to serve as the hands and feet of Christ, being that support system that helps her not just survive, but thrive."

Illinois March for Life

Throughout 2022, We Dignify led active discernment for the March for Life Chicago's direction in consultation with partner organizations including Illinois Right to Life, the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, Wisconsin Right to Life, and Illinois Knights of Columbus and conversations with Catholic Respect Life Ministries at the Archdiocese of Chicago and the Diocese of Springfield

Thy Will Be Done...Praying Scripture for Life

- 1. According to Titis 2:7, we pray for all those who love Life and work daily to protect it. May each of us show ourselves in all respects to be models of good works, and in our teaching show integrity, dignity, and sound speech that cannot be condemned, so that all our opponents may be put to shame, finding no evil for which to condemn us. We ask this, Lord, for our churches as they stand on your Word, for workers in pregnancy resource centers and medical facilities, as they come alongside the vulnerable, and for each of us as individuals who are known as your people.
- 2. According to Philippians 4:8, we pray for the heart of our nation: for the youth who are growing into a new day, for the leaders of our state and federal government, we ask you to fill their hearts with truth, with honorable things, with justice, with purity, with loveliness, with commendable ideas, with a desire for excellence, and with praiseworthy ambition. You alone, dear Lord, are able to change the hardened heart and we ask you to do this for our country. May the love of God enter in and drive out the destructive darkness that is so pervasivel
- 3. According to Psalm 34: 12-14, we pray for the elderly. Dear Father let those of advanced years desire life and love every day they are given to serve you. Please grant them as many days as you have planned for them and protect them from those who would shorten their days. When we begin to
