# Dealing with the Unknown

Read over 2 Corinthians 4:16 through 18... ALL our "momentary afflictions" mentioned in verse 17 is a huge understatement. They hurt when they happen to us. But they serve to highlight where our real hope is set: the real life of this Spirit is being renewed by the power of God.

God's horizon is bounded by an eternal prospect in verse 18: "as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, (They don't last long in the eyes of God.) but the things that are unseen are eternal." With the eyes of faith in Christ one is enabled to see beyond the visible and tangible by which the adversaries at Corinth set so much store to the eternal realities of that world where God's glory shines in Christ. Since early December Marilyn and I and family members have wondered what sudden degenerative illness has caused Marilyn to have a sudden inability to walk without a walker. Dealing with the unknown can be very hard when it deals with yourself or someone close to you. Even

though these "momentary afflictions" are not slight to us, they are very "momentary" in God's eyes. Whether they are part of

"momentary" in God's eyes. Whether they are part of life's trials or tests from God, God wants to work through them to strengthen and renew or restore our faith in him IF WE LET HIM!

'Trust in the Lord with ALL YOUR HEART, and do not lean on your own understanding. In ÁLL YOUR WAYS acknowledge Him, He will make straight your paths" (Proverbs 3: 5-6). I encourage you to pray daily over these words for God to help you put your full trust in Him and "make straight your paths." When the going gets tough, PUT YOUR TRUST IN GOD! When we put our trust in ourselves or too much in doctors or someone else, eventually they will let us down or we will fall flat on our faces trying to do everything on our own. We cannot do everything on our own. We cannot save ourselves from following the sin either. We are natural born sinners who desperately need to trust God to save us from our sin, self, and Satan and all his evil workers and ways. Put your trust in God who sent his son to save us from our sin, self, and Satan and all his evil workers and ways through His horrible death on the cross. Imagine Jesus dying for each of your sins on the cross. Imagine being below the cross with his mother Mary

and His disciple John watching him die a horrible death FOR YOU!... When you are there with him beneath the cross, his death becomes more meaningful, more personal for YOUR SALVATION! His death on the cross is no longer just for someone else's šins. He died for YOU TOO! He died to save you from your sins and rose from the dead to give you the gift of eternal life! "Don't fret or worry. Instead of worrying, PRAY. Let petitions and praises shape your worries into prayers, letting God know your concerns. Before you know it, a sense of God's wholeness, everything coming together for good, will come and settle you down. It's wonderful what's happens when Christ displace's worry at the center of your life" (Philippians 4: 6-7 in The Message Bible).

Lord, overcome my worries and fears with Your joy-filled resurrection hope in eternal life and Your presence with us ALWAYS!
Jesus said, "I am with you ALWAYS" (Matthew 28: 20). You overcame sin, self and Satan through Your resurrection. Enable us to put our full trust in You to overcome all our fears, worries and anxieties. In Jesus name. Amen.

## Life Comes in Chapters

What do you do when you learn that somebody in your community is doing something to support a Life-affirming ministry your group supports as well? When the Red Bud Lions hosted their annual "Spring to Life" BBQ, to benefit the local pregnancy care center, the Southwestern Illinois Lutherans For Life Chapter knew exactly what to do. They came along side with a bake sale to further support the pregnancy care center and to provide desserts for those attending the BBQ.

All proceeds from the bake sale and the BBQ go to the local pregnancy care center, LIFE NETWORK, with offices located in both Waterloo and Red Bud, IL. The Southwestern Chapter includes members from three area churches. 5-6 bakers from St. John's Lutheran Church in Red Bud and Trinity Lutheran in Prairie usually provide goodies for the sale. Most of their bakers are members of the Chapter, but a few others have joined them when they read about the event on Facebook. Bakers generally bring the goodies directly to the BBQ half an hour before it officially opens.

Chapter leader, Jennifer Becker-Roscow and two or three other members of the Chapter sit at the bake sale table throughout the Spring to Life event. The event was held March 26, 2025 and raised over \$3,000 for Life Network.

Jennifer tells me this is not the only time the Chapter works on behalf of Life Network, however.

"We do a Baby Bottle project --- the baby bottles are provided by Life Network. I give them away on Life Sunday in January and collect them about 30 days later. Those who take the bottle fill it with change and drop it back off in a box at church. We are also an underwriter for Life Network's annual banquet. We have done baby items drive for them in the past but not recently."

## Every Life is an Impossibly Unrepeatable Mathematical Miracle

Originally published as part of the local 40 Days for Life Campaign headed up by the Southwest Coalition, Inc....

"Imagine this: there are currently 8 billion people alive today, and an estimated 100 billion who have ever lived. With each human being, 23 chromosomes from a mother and 23 from a father combine in a unique way. What are the odds of your specific DNA being repeated? It's one in a nonillion—a one followed by 30 zeroes.

To grasp the enormity of this number, consider this: scientists estimate there are about 7.5 quintillion grains of sand on Earth. It would still take a trillion Earths to equate to a nonillion grains of sand, with you being just one of those grains.

Astronomers believe there are approximately 200 sextillion stars in the observable universe—that's 200 billion trillion stars! Yet, it would still take five million universes to match a nonillion stars, with you being one of those stars.

Scientists estimate the sun will die out in 5 billion years. Assuming human population growth continues uninterrupted, that's a maximum potential is 2.5 quadrillion humans. Even at this maximum, only 0.0000000000000025% of all possible humans would have ever existed—meaning 99.999999999975% of humans who could exist will never exist!

The chance of any person's unique genetic code being repeated is never! The fact that you exist at all is a mathematical impossibility!

How much more tragic is it when a sin-

gle life is lost. Every life is sacred, not only because we are made in the image and likeness of God but also due to the miraculous improbability of our existence. Let us cherish each unrepeatable life, advocating for a world that recognizes the inherent rarity, uniqueness, and value of every individual."

Among those is writing legislation that made Illinois one of the first states to have written into their state law the definition of marriage as being between a man and a woman! Once upon a time...that was a given, but Mr. Curtin was watching events happening elsewhere and in the 1990's was able to convey this in such a way that our legislators passed it!

We also look forward to hearing from Kim Marxhausen, author of the book, Weary Joy: the Caregiver's Journey. In this book, Kim takes us through her

own journey as a caregiver and helps us see ways to grow as Christians through the process. She not only has personal experience to bring to the table, but has a background in psychology and a solid understanding of the Word of God, that she has been able to apply to the subject.

From the book: "Our memory systems are beautiful and intricate. The fields of neuroscience and psychology are just now creating models that help us understand how we learn and remember and how we forget. God's memory is more straightforward for us to describe. God remembers everything and He remembers it forever. He chooses to forget our sin, but He never forgets His children."

Kim will have copies of her book with her. If you find yourself in a caregiving role and would like some encouragement, or know someone who is in that situation, you will have the opportunity to purchase it from her. I found many practical suggestions, as well for those in "survival mode".

We will also be hearing from some wonderful people who dedicate every day of their working lives to furthering the cause of Life: Julia Heinz of Redeeming Life Outreach Ministry will be with us and will share news from the new maternity home in East Dundee, Illinois. Elmi Patton, of First Step Women's Center in Springfield, Illinois, will share their work with those facing surprise pregnancy in Springfield. Jen Hall, of We are Called to Care ministry to foster families, will help us as the Church, to be the hands and feet of Jesus in caring for these precious little ones and the families who shelter them in foster care. We are so blessed to be able to hear what these folks on the frontlines have to say to us!

At last year's Summer Life Gathering, we received some requests for information on other specific end of life issues that were not included in the event. With those requests in mind, we will also be hearing from some experts in that area: John Talley, lawyer and LFL National Board member will explain the durable power of attorney for health care. Also presenting some specific information on end of life and funeral planning will be Pastor Wendorf, of St. John's Lutheran Church, Chatham, and the Jerry Curry, Director of the Curry Funeral Home in Pawnee, Illinois.

As always, we most look forward to seeing YOU face to face! It is not too late to register, if you have not yet done so!

# Voting with Your Pocketbook...vote for CPC support

Another Life-Affirming feature of this company is that they work directly with the coffee farmers who produce their products. As they exceed Fair Trade payment, they are not supporting slavery in another country. When we lived in rural Africa, the illiterate family farmers who sold coffee to itinerate coffee buyers were often cheated, because they couldn't decipher what the portable scales being used said about their coffee. In other areas, large companies use dehumanizing slave labor to provide a crop for export. Either way the farmer takes a hit. As an Illinoisan with a heart for the farm, and a For-Life Christian, I find it hard to take!

Those of you who were in Springfield for the Illinois Pro-Life March, saw something of the numbers we represent. I'm guessing every one of the couple thousand present knew half a dozen For Life folks who because of work, physical limitations, or other obligations was not able to be there that day. And that was here in Illinois, one of the most anti-life states in the union! Considering that, we, the For Life Community, are an economic force to be dealt with! If we use that power of numbers, we can make a difference For Life by means of our purchasing choices.

Although I was looking for Christmas gifts, when I first sought out Seven Weeks Coffee, they also offer subscriptions for those who want coffee on a regular basis. Birth Choice, "A Tennessee pregnancy clinic is establishing an adoption agency among its service offerings, becoming one of just a handful of U.S. centers to do so....

#### God's providence

[Lisa] Reasons began in her role with Birth Choice on January 20 of this year after completing her master's degree in social work and praying for new direction in her career. She learned about Birth

<u>Choice</u> founder and Director Brent Lambert and followed him on social media.

Reasons told Pregnancy Help News that she "felt a strong impression" to reach out to him last November and did so via Facebook Messenger. Lambert responded and invited her to come to his office at Birth Choice the following week. Upon meeting with him, Reasons learned that he and the organization's board had decided to pursue creating an adoption agency within the offerings of the pregnancy help organization and that they needed someone with a master's degree in social work to oversee it.

"The timing was ... well, you just can't make it up," she said.

Reasons is adopted and so is her son. She said for many years she's felt a burden for those without someone and a nudge to help those kids who are already here.

Reasons believes every Christian has a role in the arenas of foster care and adoption.

"It's not the state, it's not the government, it's not the world - it's we, the church, who are to take away the argument [reasons given for abortion, including child abuse and neglect]," she said. "We can't just say we're pro-life, we're pro-life by what we do. Everybody's part looks different, but we all have

"There are lots of different ways to be involved," Reasons added."

The human nose can detect one-millionth of one milligram of garlic floating in the air and distinguish among ten thousand

distinct odors. The hairs blanketing your body magnify the sensation of touch so that you can discern a thousandth of an ounce of pressure on the tip of a half-inch hair. Amazing, isn't it?

Trillions of chemical reactions are taking place in every cell of your body every second. You are inhaling oxygen, metabolizing energy, digesting food, maintaining equilibrium, purifying toxins, producing hormones, exhaling carbon dioxide, repairing tissues, and circulating blood. As you read this, millions of electrical impulses are firing across billions of synaptic pathways, and you don't even think about it.

But you should, and you should praise

God for the gift of life and the multitude of His blessings you enjoy. And you should do one more allimportant thing: discover your life's purpose and dedicate yourself to fulfilling it. # Good News reported from AMA

Here in Illinois we have seen Physician Assisted Suicide come before our legislature this past year. Among those lobbying for this were some who promoted the idea that PAS is a lower cost healthcare alternative for those who are suffering a terminal illness than what is currently available. There have been unconfirmed reports that this line of thinking has come from administrators of major Illinois hospitals and insurance executives. Again we see the term "healthcare" misused in serious ways! The following quote came from the Patient Rights Action Fund and appeared in LifeNews.com. The good news is that the American Medical Association seems to have noticed the incongruity of calling it healthcare to bring about death...at

least in this case.

"At its annual meeting, the American Medical Association (AMA) House of Delegates (HOD) overwhelmingly rejected an attempt to change AMA policy and in doing so re-affirmed its longstanding policy in opposition to assisted suicide. It also approved a Board of Trustees report which rejected attempts to change the longstanding and clear terminology "physician assisted suicide" in AMA policy.

Dating to 1994, the AMA Code of Medical Ethics states that "Physician-assisted suicide is fundamentally incompatible with the physician's role as healer, would be difficult or impossible to control, and would pose serious societal risks." At its 2019 annual

meeting, the House of Delegates overwhelmingly voted to uphold the Code of Medical Ethics as written. The 2025 Board of Trustees report states that "the profession of medicine should not support the legalization or practice of physician assisted suicide or see it as part of a physician's role."

Pray for our state lawmakers, as they continue to be lobbied by those in favor of Physician Assisted Suicide. May they have clear vision and an understanding that choosing cheap over restorative or palliative is not health care. God grant them discernment when those calling for "choice" stand to benefit financially by one and only one choice and are likely to pressure and manipulate others to make that their choice.

 Human Cloning

WHEREAS, God is the Creator and Giver of life, and each human being is a unique creation of God; and

WHEREAS, God has provided human beings with the gift of sexuality through which new human beings are to be procreated; and

WHEREAS, The cloning of humans, by which is meant the production of a second human

embryo for either reproduction or therapeutic purposes, which will be genetically identical to a DNA donor, allows for the circumvention of the procreative process,

and is an abuse of the gift of human knowledge in an attempt to usurp the authority

of God; therefore be it
RESOLVED, That Lutherans For Life
condemns the cloning of humans.
Should cloned humans be
produced, however, they should be
regarded by society and especially
by the people

of God as possessing full value and dignity as individuals created by God and

redeemed by Him through Christ Jesus our Lord. Be it therefore also RESOLVED, That Lutherans For Life urges its members to become informed about the scientific efforts regarding cloning human beings and to express concern that human cloning

contravenes the design of God for procreation and should not be pursued.

(Lutherans For Life takes no official position on the cloning of or genetic engineering of plants and animals.)

3. Pray that God will complete our State Board with the members of His choice!


