Thankfully, after receiving round-the-clock care from medical staff, Marcus and Macie were able to leave the hospital after three months. "As time went on they thrived more and more with very little complication," Jennifer said. "Being told the worst was likely to happen ... then for the complete opposite, felt like a miracle. I'll never forget the feeling of thinking I wouldn't leave without my babies. I was there day and night ... hoping someone would give me some hope and confirmation they would survive."
