Fearfully and Wonderfully Made ... with a God-given Identity by Michelle Bauman



You're different. If you're currently in your teen years or you've recently exited them, I'm sure you're aware of how different you are. Surrounded by peers and social pressures to fit in, you know that sameness, according to society, is the ideal. Standing in contrast to social norms can be dangerous. It makes you a target. It makes you different.

But God calls this difference good.

Those differences began in the womb, the perfect studio for God's kind of life-begetting artwork. It's in the womb that He hones His craft—weaving each cell together, combining two separate sets of 23 chromosomes to create a new and complete human being. An original YOU.
